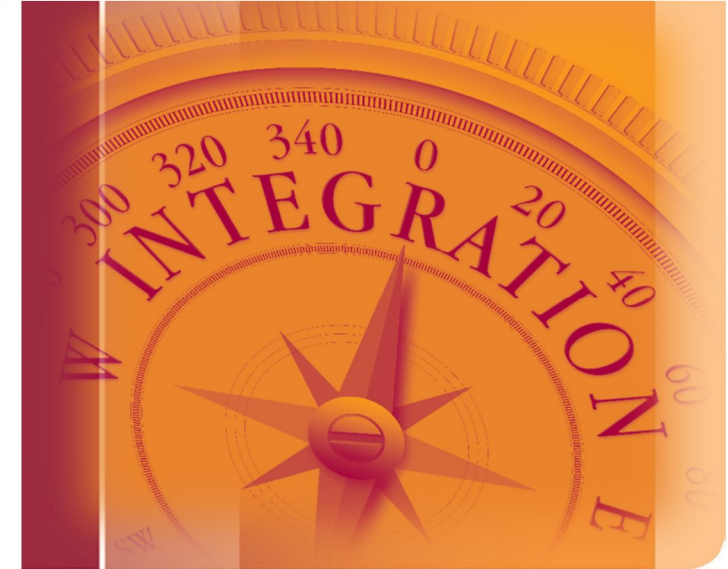

Schools for new immigrant children
and young people in Leverkusen

Learning, having fun and making contact with children of the same age – your children will be well placed in the Leverkusen schools. We provide information on the different types of schools and how the school system works.

In Germany there is **compulsory schooling**. In North Rhine-Westphalia this means that all children who will be 6 years old before 30 September of a year have to go to school.

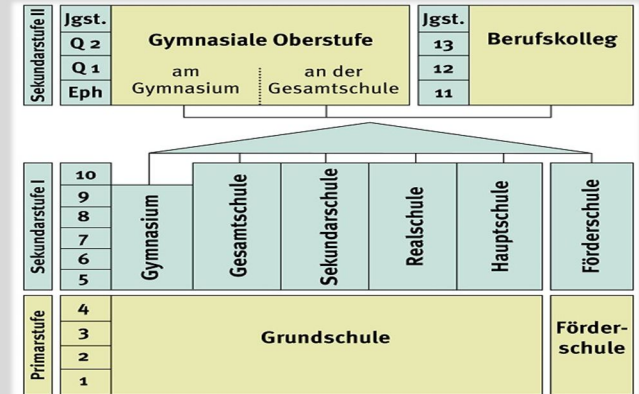
Full-time schooling is usually compulsory for a period of 10 years. After that, young people who do not have a training contract with an employer have to go to a vocational school until the end of the school year in which they turn 18 (Sect. 37, 38 SchulG NRW [School Law of North Rhine-Westphalia]).

Our goal is that children and young people can make use of their right to education in Leverkusen and learn German right from the start.

At the counselling interview, at least one parent or a guardian and the child should be present.

If you do not have sufficient knowledge of German or English you can bring a person who can interpret for you.

If you have the following documents, please bring them with you to the interview:

- ID cards/passports
- Registration certificate(s) (in German: **Anmeldebescheinigung**) by the citizens' office (**Bürgerbüro**)
- School reports and certificates from your home country

In addition, the KI also provides advice to schools on the admission of new immigrant pupils. Moreover, further training for teachers is offered and language education projects are implemented.
